- Consider taking the PSAT in the fall as a 10th grader for practice & for consideration to be a Superintendent Super Scholar.
- In the fall, all 10th graders will take the PLAN, a pre-ACT test; take it seriously § do your best.
- Continue family discussions about college choices & the costs.

 travel near a college, take time to check out the campus and begin
