13 <sup>th</sup>	<ul> <li>Officially outlawed slavery in the U.S.</li> <li>Also outlawed any type of forced labor unless it was punishment for a crime</li> </ul>
14 <sup>th</sup>	<ul> <li>It defined U.S. citizenship</li> <li>It granted everyone "equal protection under the law"</li> <li>Protects all "privileges and immunities of all citizens"</li> </ul>
15 <sup>th</sup>	<ul> <li>No state may take away a person's voting rights on the basis of their race, color, or previous enslavement</li> <li>This Amendment was for the voting rights of the former slaves</li> </ul>

20 <sup>th</sup>	<ul> <li>1933</li> <li>Newly elected presidents (Jan 20 noon) and Congress members (Jan 3 noon) take office closer to election time.</li> <li>Lame Duck</li> </ul>
21 <sup>st</sup>	<ul> <li>1933</li> <li>REPEALED 18th Amendment &amp; Prohibition/YES ALCOHOL</li> </ul>
<b>22</b> <sup>nd</sup>	<ul> <li>No president can be elected more than two terms (maximum 8 years)         PRESIDENTIAL TERM LIMITS     </li> <li>The Roosevelt rule</li> </ul>
23 <sup>rd</sup>	<ul> <li>This allowed the people living in the <b>District of Columbia</b> the right to vote in national elections</li> </ul>
24 <sup>th</sup>	1964  • Abolished poll taxes
25 <sup>th</sup>	<ul> <li>The vice president takes over when the president dies in office, resigns, or is ill. PRESIDENTIAL SUCCESSION</li> </ul>

27 <sup>th</sup>	<ul> <li>1992</li> <li>Delays Congressional pay raises until the following term</li> </ul>
