Dear Club Presidents and Leaders,

How does any adult form the opinions, preferences, prejudices and thoughts of a young person who is to step into the shoes of his/her elders? The answer is **YOU DON'T!**

Just as the present leadership generation formed its own opinions from available material, so will the oncoming leaders form their opinions. This has been shown by example in the results of the many citizenship seminars that are sponsored by Civitans all over the U.S. and Canada. These seminars typically provide a concentrated exposure to a wide variety of ideas and permit the young people to come to their own conclusions.

The material presented varies widely from seminar to seminar. The speakers are chosen for their depth of knowledge in some area of citizenship and leadership, and are asked to present their information, without censorship, directly to the participants.

The seminars are not only designed to stretch the minds of the participants but provide both social and recreational outlets. Planned activities are the order of the day. Good citizenship on a practical level is also emphasized. The participants are expected to obey the rules while on campus.

The seminars are not confined to the overall purpose of building good citizenship; they are also learning tools that leave the young people with new insight into the role of the citizen. And from it all, better citizens are built.

The worth of the Youth Forum is evident when the students return. The way they talked about the programs, the speakers and the fellowship it was obvious they got a lot from this experience. Most evident are the comments from parents and teachers on the obvious positive change in attitude and personal presentation of many of the students – quiet ones have morphed into leaders. Many of them gained more than new friends; they gained the confidence and knowledge to be true leaders.

In 1955 Civitans approached Harding University and requested a forum be developed for our youth. This forum has been very successful and popular that now almost 300 students attend each year. Harding University has built a tradition of quality speakers and programs and has provided excellent facilities to house and care for our student leaders. New leadership is molding a program to be relevant and engaging in our every changing society.

Our group from the Alabama Central District has grown significantly over the past few years. I encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity to teach the values of our country to our future leaders by sponsoring *one or more* students for the June 2019 National Leadership Forum.

What to bring to National Leadership Forum at Harding University

• <u>Bedding:</u>

- Pillow with pillowcase
- Twin bed sheets, sleeping bag or light blanket)
- Bath and Towels and bath cloth(s)
- **Toiletries** (bath soap, shampoo, toothbrush and toothpaste, deodorant)
 - Shower shoes/flip flops
- Pajamas! Underwear and socks
- Nice shirts (no spaghetti straps, halters, or tube tops; no bare midriffs), T-shirts will be great, no inappropriate or political graphics.
- Jeans and/or skirts and/or khaki pants and/or capris no gym type shorts. <u>Must be modest in length</u>, no "sofie" of Nike gym shorts.
- One nice outfit and shoes for final banquet (church clothes)

 (Note: some of the young ladies like to wear evening wear; this is acceptable but <u>must not</u> be strapless or halter top. Guys, suits are very nice, yet not required if you do not own one, nice shirt and tie will do.)
- Comfortable shoes, Tennis shoes or Water shoes with backs (like Chacos)
- Light jacket, sweater or sweatshirt auditorium is cold!
- Raincoat or poncho
- Laundry bag, Sunscreen, Insect repellent, etc.
- Spending money (Suggest \$25 \$45 optional). There is a great bookstore for Harding University souvenirs; you may want snacks and sodas (Food Court and Star Bucks on Campus).
- Any other items you might want in your dorm room that is easy to pack in your suitcase.
- What to leave at home: All electronics should be left at home: iPads, Fitbits, smart watches, Kindles, tvs, gaming systems GoPros, etc. We also ask that nerf guns, water balloons and all practical joke material not be sent to NLF. Any of these items found in your possession will be collected and returned when NLF is dismissed on Friday morning. Cell phones will be monitored and not allowed in all sessions.
